One and a half paid positions: a managing director, full time, and a box-office assistant two mornings a week. Board members, directors, actors and crew are not compensated. Names are omitted from this sample because every person connected with this organization is invented.

Part III · Program service accomplishments — sample for fiscal 2025

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MISSION

To stage live theatre made by the people of a river town, in a building they saved, at a price anyone can pay, and to give young people a first stage.

PROGRAM 1 · THE SEASON

In fiscal 2025 the Playhouse staged five productions — four on the mainstage and one by its youth company — over about forty performances in a 180-seat house, with every role and every crew position filled by volunteers. Tickets were held at \$18 and \$12 for students; the youth series admitted children under twelve free with an adult.

PROGRAM 2 · THE YOUTH COMPANY

A cast of young people aged 8 to 17, chosen by open audition, rehearsed and performed one full production with adult crew and two adults present at every rehearsal. Guardians sign consent; the Playhouse holds any permits its state requires.

THE BUILDING

A 1911 grain warehouse at the old ferry landing, owned outright since 1988. The 2019 roof, financed by 412 donors and a small loan, is repaid within the building line above.

PUBLIC DISCLOSURE

The three most recent returns and the exemption application are published on the Playhouse's website and available on request. The Playhouse reports the rule; it does not advise on it.
